

::Convention on the Rights of the Child, 1989

The Convention on the Rights of the Child is the first legally binding international instrument to incorporate the full range of human rights—civil, cultural, economic, political and social rights.

The convention: why?
Agreement and Declaration

A Declaration has no binding on the acceding States, a Convention commits signatory states to implement it.

The Convention on the Rights of the Child was adopted by the UN General Assembly on November 20, 1989.

It has become a law once it is ratified by the different countries of the world by ratifying the International Convention on Rights of the Child on January 30, 1992; the Tunisian government has placed this text upstream of the Constitution.
